Scheme number – J0832 (useful for discounted contents insurance)

Police non-emergency number - 872 5050 (24 hr)

Cheadle Heath police station – 856 9829 (7 days a week, 8am - 11pm)

Please always report crime or suspicious activities, however minor, by doing this the police get to know what's going on and see where trends are emerging so appropriate action can be taken. 999 should be used for immediate assistance or if you are witnessing an incident or crime actually happening.
